Over rolling land; through medium undergrowth; desc. 140 ft. over NE. slope.

- 14.10 Harmony Creek, 30 lks. wide, 12 ft. deep, course NNW.
- 15.70 Trail road, bears SE. and NW.; asc. 50 ft. over SW. slope.
- 25.00 Top of ascent on W. slope; desc. 40 ft. along W. slope.
- 40.34 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
