	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>UNION PLACER</u></p> <p>From Cor. No. 4 of the Union Placer, heretofore described.</p> <p>NORTH, on line 4-5 of the Union Placer.</p> <p>10.24 Cor. No. 5 of the Union Placer, monumented with a squared wooden post, mkd. as described in the official record and loosely set in a mound of earth.</p> <p>Reset the wooden post in the mound of earth and raise a mound of earth and stone, 4 ft. base, 3½ ft. high around the wooden post.</p> <hr/> <p>S. 89° 53' E., on line 5-6 of the Union Placer.</p> <p>9.84 Cor. No. 6 of the Union Placer, identical to Cor. No. 2 of the Surprise Placer, heretofore described.</p>	
	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</u></p> <hr/> <p>The land within Township 45 North, Range 52 East, ranges from about 5650 to 8650 ft. above sea level and is mountainous.</p> <p>The soil is sandy loam and rocky. On the north slopes there is dense quaken aspen and scattered fir and spruce timber. The vegetation consists of dense native grasses, wild berry bushes and sagebrush.</p> <p>The general drainage of the surveyed area is mostly westward. Old mining activity was noted in the south-east portion of the township.</p> <p>Principal users of this area are cattlemen. Access into the township are by trail roads.</p>
