

RETRACEMENT AND PARTIAL RESURVEY, N. BDY., T. 39 N., R. 40 E.

CHAINS

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, monumented with a wooden post, 2 x 2 x 48 ins. long, loosely set in a mound of earth, with pits E. and W., bears N. 89° 52' W., 37.56 chs. dist. This corner becomes an amended monument.

At the corner point

Set a copper-coated steel stake, 30 ins. long, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., 22 ins. in the ground and in a collar of stone, with brass cap, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., mkd.

Land, nearly level.
Soil, sandy clay.
Undergrowth, sagebrush.

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by H. B. Maxson, Deputy Surveyor, in 1888.

From the cor. of Tps. 38 and 39 N., Rs. 40 and 41 E.
S. 89° 58' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over rolling land, through medium undergrowth; asc. 70 ft. over E. slope.

9.40 Trail road, bears NNE. and SSW.; asc. 90 ft. over E. slope.

16.50 Slope changes to SE. slope; asc. 50 ft.

21.80 Trail road, bears SE. and NW.; asc. 50 ft. along S. slope.

34.50 Ravine, drains ESE.; asc. 80 ft. over NE. slope.

40.85 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
