GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
<p>The land surveyed within this township varies from nearly level desert land to mountainous land. The elevation varies from about 4,400 to 6,960 ft. above sea level. The Hot Springs Range of Mountains extends northerly through the eastern portion of the township. The soil varies from sandy clay on the lower elevations to sandy clay and rocky on the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, budsage, shadscale, greasewood and sparse native grasses. There is no timber.</p>	
<p>The eastern portion of the township drains easterly into Eden Valley. The remainder of the township drains westerly into the Little Humboldt River. There are 6 small springs located in secs. 14, 21, 26, 33 and 36.</p>	
<p>There are no settlements within the township. Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by trail roads. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>
