Reestablishment of the survey executed by
E. A. Carter, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1881.

From the cor. of Tps. 17 and 18 S., Rs. 51 and 52 E.,
monumented with a limestone, 12x6x6 ins., mkd. with 6
notches on N., S., E. and W. faces and firmly set in
a mound of stone.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
