

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE E. BDY. OF T. 17 S., R. 51 E.

CHAINS

raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

54.10 Graded road, bears NE. and SW.

66.20 Fence cor.; fences bear N. and W.

76.23 The closing cor. of secs. 1 and 6, T. 17 S., Rs. 51 and 52 E., on the Fourth Standard Parallel South, monumented with the remains of a wooden post, 2 ins. square, 12 ins. long, dimly mkd. and with a steel rod, 1 in. diam., 18 ins. long, driven alongside the corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

From this same corner the standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 16 S., R. 52 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 17 S., R. 52 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group, bears N. 89° 58' E., 32.33 chs. dist.
