GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The township lies mostly in the Ash Meadow Valley. The south and east portions are in the foothills of the Specter Mountain Range. The soil consists of a sandy loam in the valley with clay and exposed limestone in the mountains.

The vegetation consists of greasewood, creosote, cacti and scattered bunchgrass.

Access into the area is provided by U.S. Highway No. 95, Nevada State Highway No. 16 and desert roads.

There is a ranch located in secs. 7 and 8.

There are numerous abandoned mines in the SE. portion of the township.
