	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	<p>Township 14 North, Range 66 East, is nearly level in the eastern portion to mountainous in the western portion. The elevation ranges from about 5,800 to 7,200 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay on the lower elevations to sandy clay, gravelly and rocky in the mountains. The timber is composed of scattered juniper and pinon. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, greasewood and whitesage.</p> <p>Cooper Canyon drains easterly across the north portion of the township. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>U.S. Highway, Nos. 6 and 50, enters the township at the south boundary of section 33 and bears northeast across the southeast corner, leaving the township at the east boundary of section 25. Highway F.A.S. 739 bears NNE. through the east portion of the township.</p> <p>Principle users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by desert roads.</p>
