From the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.

N. 1°-12' W., bet. secs. 35 and 36:

Over nearly level land, through scattering undergrowth.

39.92 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with the remains of a squared post, 1x1x20 ins., loosely set in a mound of earth, with scribe marks dimly visible.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
