

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE WEST BOUNDARY
T. 12 N., R. 67 E.

CHAINS

Land, nearly level.
Soil, sandy and gravelly clay loam.
Undergrowth, sagebrush and greasewood.

N. 0° 16' E., bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over slightly rolling land, through scattered undergrowth.

20.00 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains SE.

34.30 Trail road, bears ENE. and WSW.

40.22 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, monumented with a squared wooden post, 2 ins. square, 28 ins. long, loosely set in a small mound of stone, with scribe marks dimly visible but illegible.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

reset the squared wooden post alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

N. 0° 22' E., beginning new measurement.

Over slightly rolling land, through scattered undergrowth.

40.14 The cor. of Tps. 12 and 13 N., Rs. 66 and 67 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the concurrent dependent resurvey of the South boundary of T. 13 N., R. 67 E., executed under this same Group.

Land, slightly rolling.
Soil, sandy and gravelly clay loam.
Undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood and white sage.
