

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY
T. 13 N., R. 67 E.

CHAINS

Beginning at the corner of Tps. 12 and 13 N., Rs. 67 and 68 E., monumented with the remains of a squared wooden post, 2 ins. square, 24 ins. long, with scribe marks dimly visible and loosely set in a mound of stone.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

reset the squared post alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, S. of cor.

From this corner, a copper-coated steel stake, ½ in. diam., firmly driven in the ground, marked U-64-1 1962, established in connection with the tellurometer survey under Group No. 389, bears N. 13° 11' W., 4.67 chs. dist.

N. 89° 53' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over rolling land, through medium-heavy undergrowth; desc. 210 ft. over a gradual W. slope.

40.10 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 4 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone to top, 4 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.
