	Over rolling land, through scattered timber.
0.90	Trail road, bears E. and W.; asc. 60 ft. over a S. slope.
6.00	Small spur, slopes W.; desc. 60 ft. over a N. slope.
8.40	Ravine, drains W.; asc. 90 ft. over a S. slope.

33.70	Trail road, bears WNW. and ESE.
39.47	The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with a granite stone, 12x8x4 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone and plainly mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on the W. face.
