CHAINS

From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.

N. 0° 13' W., bet. secs. 5 and 6.

Over nearly level land, through scattered undergrowth.

Point for the $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 13 North, Range 67 East is located in Spring Valley and is nearly level in the western half and is slightly rolling in the eastern half of the township.

The elevation ranges from about 5,800 feet above sea level in the central portion of the valley, to 6,300 feet above sea level at the SE. corner of the township, and then rises gradually along the eastern side of the township to about 6,900 feet above sea level at the NE. corner of the township. The eastern tier of sections is covered with a medium growth of pinon and juniper timber, which for the most part is small and would be considered as non-commercial.

The soils are sandy and gravelly clay loam and in the central portion there are some alkaline soils. Vegetation consists mostly of sagebrush and greasewood with some sparse native grasses along the drainages. There are also some seeded crested wheatgrass pastures which are being established.
