<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area resurveyed in Township 14 North, Range 67 East, is nearly level to gently rolling land. The elevation ranges from about 5,600 to 5,800 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy, clay and gravelly. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, greasewood and white-sage.</p> <p>Most of the township is drained by dry washes. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Access into the township is provided by U. S. Highway Nos. 6 and 50, which bears northeasterly across the township and other desert roads. Principal users of the area are cattlemen.</p>
