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## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 26 North, Range 64 East, is rolling and mountainous. The western portion is mountainous and covered with heavy juniper, pinon and scattered aspen. The elevation ranges from about 5,900 to 8,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from clay silt and light gravel on the lower elevations to gravelly and rocky on the mountainous. The vegetation consists mainly of sagebrush and shadscale in the lower elevations and blackbrush, bitterbrush and native grasses on the mountain slopes.

The township is located at the north end of Steptoe Valley, with the western portion of the township on the east slope of the Cherry Creek Mountains. The township is drained by Indian Creek and other tributaries of Goshute Lake. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are sheepmen and cattlemen and access into the township is provided by desert roads.
