GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
<p>Township 26 North, Range 65 East, is located at the north end of Steptoe Valley. The west boundary of the township is on the east edge of Goshute Lake which is dry most of the year. The land within the township is nearly level except in the northeastern portion which is gently rolling. The elevation is about 6,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam to light gravel. The vegetation consists mainly of sagebrush, shadscale, greasewood and sparse native grasses.</p> <p>There are a number of Homestead Entries being established in the southern portion of the township. Three wells had been dug in secs. 20 and 21 with preparations being made to dig more wells. Land improvements are underway in some of the other sections. Elbow Spring is the only permanent source of water for livestock in the township.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Access to the township is provided by U. S. Highway No. 93, located in the central portion, and U. S. Highway No. 50, in the southeast corner of the township. Trail roads are found throughout the township.</p>
