GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Township 17 North, Range 37 East, M.D.M., is situated on the western slope of the Desatoya Mountain Range, about 60 miles east of Fallon, Nevada. Access to the area is provided by U. S. Highway No. 50 which crosses the extreme southwest portion of sec. 31. Further access into the township is provided by numerous secondary and trail roads. The elevation varies from 5,200 to 7,600 ft. above sea level. Terrain varies from mountainous to gently rolling.

Soil consists principally of sandy clay alluvium. There are scattered stands of juniper and pinon timber at the higher elevations. Rock Canyon, Willow Creek, Big Dew Creek, Little Dew Creek and tributaries drain the township to the west and southwest. No significant mineral deposits were noted in the portion surveyed.

A seep spring is situated in section 31, the tie to which is given in the field notes of T. 16 N., R. 37 E., surveyed concurrently under the same group.

A University of Nevada Experimental Hydrology Plot is located in sec. 3. Principal users of the area currently are cattlemen. There are no residents in the township.
