CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the survey of a portion of the south boundary of T. 10 N., R. 42 E. and a portion of the subdivisional lines of T. 9 N., R. 42 E., Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada.

The directions of the lines of this survey were determined by altitude observations of the sun. The lines were carried forward by sustained angulation being supplemented by other altitude observations of the sun taken throughout the progress of this survey. The vertical angles of measurements made on the slope were ascertained by a clinometer in good adjustment; the horizontal equivalents only are entered in the field notes.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1947, and the Special Instructions dated May 20, 1966.

The geographic position for the southeast corner of the township is at latitude 38° 35' 18.3" N. and longitude 117° 12' 08.7" W., taken from protraction diagram No. 222, approved October 8, 1963.

The magnetic declination was read at a number of stations throughout the township and the average of these readings was found to be $16\frac{1}{2}$ ° east.
