Timber, scattered juniper and pinon.

Undergrowth, sagebrush and shadscale.

The N. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1 is on the S. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 10 N., R. 42 E. and is 40.00 chs. in departure from the closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within the east range of Township 9 North, Range 42 East, slopes east over rolling land. The elevation ranges from about 5,700 to 6,400 feet above sea level. The soil is sandy loam, gravel and rocky. Vegetation consists of shadscale, sagebrush and native grasses. There is a small amount of scattered juniper and pinon.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by trail roads.
