CHAINS

38.98 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, monumented with the remains of a wooden post, firmly set alongside a steel fence post and in a mound of stone. This cor. now refers to sec. 1 only.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
