The southeastern portion is mountainous. The elevation ranges from about 4,600 to 5,500 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay and alkali on the lower elevations to sandy clay loam, gravelly and rocky on the mountains. There is no timber. The vegetation consists of greasewood, shadscale and saltgrass.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen, and access into the township is provided by a graded gravel road and other trail roads.</p>
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
