Hatch, Eaton and Smyles, U. S. Deputy Surveyors,
in 1872.

Beginning at the cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 N., Rs. 43 and
44 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set,
mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

N. 0° 12' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through medium undergrowth.

8.00 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains W.

27.80 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains W.

40.05 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with a
wooden post, 2x2x24 ins. long, plainly scribed and
loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

reset the wooden post and set a steel fence post, 5½ ft.
long, 2½ ft. in the ground alongside the iron post.

N. 0° 08' E., beginning new measurement.

Over nearly level land.

35.00 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains W.

40.14 Point for the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, at pro-
portionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of
the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
