of the Tp., monumented with a wooden post, 2x2x32 ins.,
dimly scribed and loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
