N. 0° 18' E., along the E. bdy. of sec. 1, T. 29 N., R. 44 E.

Over rolling land, through medium undergrowth; desc. 70 ft. over a N. slope.

32.70 Trail road, bears SE. and NW.; desc. 20 ft. over a N. slope.

39.94 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 1, monumented with the remains of a wooden post. This wooden post is correlated with other existing original corners and topography features.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

28.00 Wash, 30 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains NW.

40.02 The cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 N., Rs. 44 and 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the current resurvey of T. 30 N., R. 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Land, rolling.

Soil, sandy gravel.

Undergrowth, shadscale, budsage and sagebrush.
