GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 29 North, Range 44 East, ranges from about 4,600 to 6,200 ft. above sea level and is nearly level to mountainous in the southeast part of the township. The soil is sandy gravel and rocky in the higher elevations and sandy gravel in the lower elevations. There is juniper and pinon in the mountains. The vegetation consists of shadscale, budsage, greasewood, sagebrush and sparse native grasses.

The township is drained by two small creeks, Mill Creek and Trout Creek, that traverse the township. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and sheepmen. Access into the township is provided by Nevada State Highway No. 8A that enters the township in section 31 on the South bdy. and leaves in section 5 on the North bdy. Access is also provided by graded gravel and trail roads scattered throughout the township. There are no settlements within the township.
