At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to underlying rock and in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
