	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area resurveyed within Township 30 North, Range 45 East, varies from mountainous in the south and east portions which includes a part of the Shoshone Range to nearly level in the northwest portion with the remaining terrain being gently rolling. The elevation ranges from about 4,600 to 8,200 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy clay loam including rocky areas on the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, budsage, greasewood and sparse native grasses. There are stands of cottonwood, aspen, chokecherry and willow along the canyons in the mountainous area.</p>
