

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE WEST BOUNDARY,
T. 29 N., R. 45 E.

CHAINS

N. 0° 15' E., beginning new measurement.

Over gently rolling land.

4.52 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1, T. 29 N., R. 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., monumented with an iron post, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 29 N., R. 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., surveyed concurrently under this same Group.

Desc. 40 ft. over a NE. slope.

31.50 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, through Crippen Canyon, drains NW.

40.31 The cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 N., R. 45 E., monumented with an iron post, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 30 N., R. 45 E., re-surveyed concurrently under this same Group.

From this corner, the closing cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 N., R. 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., monumented with an iron post, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 30 N., R. 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., surveyed concurrently under this same Group, bears N. 0° 07' E., 4.24 chs. dist.

Land, rolling.

Soil, sandy gravel.

Undergrowth, shadscale, budsage and sagebrush.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES
T. 29 N., R. 45 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed
by S. T. Morse, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1901.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 30 and 31 is monumented with a granite stone, 6x12x18 ins., plainly mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face and firmly set in a mound of stone.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground and in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.

bury the marked stone alongside the iron post.

From this corner, a pinon, 10 ins. diam., plainly scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S31 BT, bears SOUTH, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist. There is no official record of this bearing tree.
