GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Township 18 North, Range 34 East, M.D.M., is situated in the southern end of Dixie Valley and on the western slope of the Louderback Mountains, about 34 miles East of Fallon, Nevada. Access to the area is provided by the Dixie Valley Road and several trail roads. The terrain varies from gently rolling to mountainous, with elevations from about 3,900 to 6,400 feet above sea level. The area is draining to the north by a prominent wash system exiting at the north boundary of section 4.

The soil ranges from sandy clay to rocky. Vegetation is comprised of brush and grasses; there is no timber.

There is a water well in section 20. At present there are no active mines in the township; however, there has been a considerable amount of mining and mineral exploration work in sections 1 and 2. The principal ore was gold.

The township has no residents. Currently, the areas major use is grazing.
