E. H. Dyer, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1863 and 1864,
including ties made to the Survey Executed by
Frank H. Criss, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1901.

NOTE: No marks were placed on the west half of the caps
of the corner monuments set at the original (Dyer) cor-
ners as these corners are west of the east bdy. of
T. 33 N., R. 33 E. as resurveyed in 1901.

The cor. of secs. 19 and 30, on the W. bdy. of the Tp.,
monumented with a wooden post, 1x1x14 ins. long, loosely
set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
