	<p>Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by A. J. Hatch, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1868.</p> <hr/> <p>From the cor. of Tps. 32 and 33 N., R. 35 E. N. 0° 10' W., along the W. bdy. of sec. 32. Over gently rolling land, through medium undergrowth.</p>
13.00	Wash, 10 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, drains WNW.
23.40	Paved road to Nevada Massachusetts Tungsten Mine, bears ESE. and WNW.
33.40	Wash, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains NNW.
34.00	Trail road, bears SE. and WNW.
35.58	The closing cor. of secs. 25 and 36, T. 33 N., R. 34½ E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 33 N., R. 34½ E., executed concurrently under this same group.
37.30	Telephone line, bears ESE. and WNW.
38.40	Fence, bears NW. and SE.
39.38	Point selected for the witness ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 32. Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
	<p>WC T33N R34½E R35E ↑ ¼ S 32 1966</p>
	set a steel fence post, 7 ft. long, 2½ ft. in the ground, alongside the iron post.
39.98	True point for the ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 32, at midpoint on the W. bdy. of sec. 32; falls in irrigation canal, draining WNW.; where corner cannot be perpetuated.
40.60	Trail road on top of levee, bears ESE. and WNW.; enter over nearly level river bottom land.
58.90	Left bank of Humboldt River, bears WSW. and ENE.; thence over river, course WSW.
