GENERAL DESCRIPTION:	
<p>The area resurveyed within Township 35 North, Range 35 East varies from gently rolling sand dunes to nearly level river bottom land in the southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of the township. The elevation ranges from about 4,200 to 4,300 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy in the upland and black loam in the bottom land. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale and budsage on the upland; yellowbrush and native grasses on the river bottom.</p>	
<p>The land drains easterly into the Humboldt River which crosses sections 25 and 36 of the township. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>	
<p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by trail roads.</p>
