Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by Preble and
Thorburn, U. S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1881.

Beginning at the cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 N., Rs. 60 and
61 E., monumented with a wooden post, 10 ins. long, 1 in.
diam., badly deteriorated and set in a circle of stone.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
