The closing cor. of T. 30 N., Rs. 60 and 61 E., monumented with a wooden post, 16 ins. long, 1 in. diam., badly deteriorated and loosely set in a small mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

bury the original wooden post and set a steel fence post alongside the iron post.

From this cor., the standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 31 N., R. 60 E., bears S. 89° 55' W., 19.56 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the resurvey of the Sixth Standard Parallel North, through R. 60 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.
