From this cor., the standard cor. of T. 31 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E., bears S.  $89^{\circ} 52'$  E., 12.41 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the resurvey of the Sixth Standard Parallel North, through R. 60 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.

From the same cor., the standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 31 N., R. 59 E., bears N.  $89^{\circ} 52'$  W., 27.74 chs. dist., monumented with a wooden post, 14 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  and set in a circle of stone.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
