36.64	<p>The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, on the W. bdy. of the Tp.</p> <p>Land, nearly level. Soil, sandy clay loam. Undergrowth, greasewood and meadowgrass.</p>
	<p>From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.</p> <p>N. 0° 35' E., bet. secs. 5 and 6.</p> <p>Over nearly level land, through medium undergrowth.</p>
26.00	Franklin River, drains SW.
40.63	<p>Point for the $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>T30N R60E</p> <p>$\frac{1}{2}$</p> <p>S 6 S 5</p> <p>1967</p> </div> <p>raise a mound of stone, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.</p>

80.34	<p>Intersect the Sixth Standard Parallel North.</p> <p>The closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6, monumented with a wooden post, 24 ins. long, 1 in. diam., dimly scribed and loosely set in a small mound of earth.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>T31N</p> <p>S 31</p> <hr/> <p>S 6 S 5</p> <p>T30N R60E</p> <p>CC</p> <p>1967</p> </div> <p>bury the original wooden post alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.</p> <p>From this corner, the standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32, bears S. 89° 47' E., 14.92 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the resurvey of the Sixth Standard Parallel North, through R. 60 E., executed under this same Group.</p>
