40.06	Point for the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. SC T31N R60E <u>$\frac{1}{4}$ S 31</u>
	1967 set a steel fence post alongside the iron post.
56.04	The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6, T. 30 N., R. 60 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 30 N., R. 60 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.
67.50	Fence, bears N. and S.
80.12	The standard cor. of T. 31 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E., monumented with a wooden post, 24 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., dimly scribed and set in a circle of stone. At the corner point Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. SC T31N R59E R60E <u>S 36 S 31</u>
	1967 bury the original wooden post and set a steel fence post alongside the iron post. Land, nearly level. Soil, sandy clay loam. Undergrowth, sagebrush and native grasses.
