

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES, T. 30 N., R. 61 E.

CHAINS

The point for the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6, on the Sixth Standard Parallel North and at proportionate distance on the N. bdy. of sec. 6.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

From this corner, the standard cor. of T. 31 N., Rs. 60 and 61 E., bears N. $89^{\circ} 31' W.$, 14.93 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 30 North, Range 61 East, is nearly level except the northeastern portion which is rolling. The elevation ranges from about 6,000 to 6,500 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy clay on the lower elevations to gravelly and rocky on the rolling slopes. The timber is composed of scattered juniper and pinon on the higher elevations. The vegetation consists mainly of sagebrush, saltbrush, greasewood and native grasses.

No mineral formations were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are stockmen and access into the township is provided by desert roads.
