## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

A considerable variety of land and soil are found in the surveyed portion of Township 16 North, Range 63 East. The elevation varies from about 6,400 to 8,000 ft. above sea level. The south-eastern portion of the township is nearly level to rolling and the north-central portion is mountainous. The soil varies from sandy clay and gravelly on the rolling land to sandy clay and rocky on the mountainous land. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood, rabbit brush and sparse native grasses. The timber consists of juniper and pinon of little commercial value.

Steptoe Creek drains northerly through the eastern portion of the township, Gleason Creek drains easterly through the central portion and numerous small washes drains the northern portion into Steptoe Valley.

Sec. 16 and portions of secs. 15, 21 and 22 comprise the City of Ely. The remaining surveyed area is used chiefly for stock raising. There are no active mining operations in the surveyed area, however, there has been considerable mining exploration in secs. 9 and 16.

U. S. Highway, Nos. 6, 50 and 93, and Nevada Northern Railroad cross the township. Other access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved roads.
