

INDEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE THIRD STANDARD
PARALLEL NORTH, THROUGH RANGE 27 EAST

CHAINS

from this corner

The E. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1, T. 15 N., R. 26 E., bears SOUTH, 21.58 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 1 in. in diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

The closing township cor. of Tps. 15 and 16 N., Rs. 26 and 27 E., bears NORTH, 7.61 chs. dist., monumented with a basalt stone, 15x8x8 ins., plainly mkd. with 6 grooves on E., S., and W. faces of the stone. The corner stone is firmly set and exposed 10 ins. above the ground, centered in a collar of stone with a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, S. of cor. I verify that the corner is on the S. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 16 N., R. 26 E. and remonument as follows:

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 5 ins. in the ground to rock and in a mound of stone, 5 ft. base to cap, with brass cap mkd.

INDEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY OF
T. 17 N., R. 27 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA.

This Independent Resurvey Supersedes the Survey Executed by E. B. Monroe, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1868. A diligent search was made for all original corners and ties to those recovered are indicated herein.

From the cor. of Tps. 16 and 17 N., Rs. 27 and 28 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the concurrent dependent resurvey of T. 16 N., R. 28 E.

WEST, along the S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over nearly level land, along the general course of a rough bladed road.

22.51 The N. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1, hereinafter described. Asc. 40 ft. over a gentle E. slope.

40.00 Point for the S. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
