DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY,
T. 33 N., R. 37 E. MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by William Epler, U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1867, and Resurveyed by T. A. Haigh, U. S. Surveyor, and A. L. Harris, U. S. Transitman, in 1913.

Beginning the resurvey at the cor. of Tps. 32 and 33 N., Rs. 37 and 38 E., determined at the cor. of fences bearing S. and W. and in line with fences to the E. and N. This point is locally recognized as the true corner point and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

S. 89° 48' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through scant undergrowth; along fence extending W.

40.51 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record at cor. of fence bearing E. and S. We remarked the brass cap to read as follows:

Asc. 50 ft. over a gradual E. slope.

33.90 Trail road, bears NE. and SW.; asc. 10 ft. over a gradual E. slope.

40.23 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, identical with station HAYDEN of the Nevada Planning Division of the Nevada State Highway Department, monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.
