## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 32 North, Range 38 East, ranges from about 4,450 to 4,950 ft. above sea level, and is nearly level to gently rolling. The soil is sandy clay loam. The vegetation consists of greasewood, shadscale, budsage, sagebrush and sparse native grasses. There is no timber.

There are some cultivated fields in secs. 35 and 36. The Hot Springs Ranch house is located in Sec. 36. One windmill, "Turner Well", is located in sec. 18.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by the Grass Valley road, which is a graded gravel road that enters the township in sec. 3 and leaves in sec. 36, plus other desert and trail roads throughout the township.
