Beginning at the cor. of Tps. 32 and 33 N., Rs. 38 and 39 E., monumented with an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the concurrent resurvey of T. 32 N., R. 38 E.

N.  $0^{\circ} 06'$  E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling land, through medium undergrowth; asc. 150 ft. over a SW. slope to the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

14.50 Trail road bears ENE. and WSW.

19.50 Trail road bears E. and W.

22.40 Ravine drains WNW.

24.20 Trail road bears ESE. and WNW.

40.13 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with a granite stone,  $6 \times 10 \times 16$  ins., firmly set in the ground and plainly mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  on the W. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to cap, 4 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.
