N. 0° 44' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over gently rolling land, through medium undergrowth.

- 5.60 Trail road bears ENE. and WSW.
- 39.91 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with a quartzite stone, 4x8x12 ins., firmly set in the ground and plainly mkd. ¼ on the W. face.
- At the corner point
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
