Soil, sandy clay loam. Undergrowth, shadscale and budsage.</p>	
	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within this township is nearly level to mountainous. The elevation ranges from about 4,000 ft. to 6,800 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from clay loam and rocky in the mountains to sandy clay loam in the lower elevations. The vegetation consists of budsage, sagebrush, shadscale, greasewood and sparse native grasses.</p> <p>Clear Creek, flowing in a westerly direction, enters the township on the east boundary of sec. 13.</p> <p>There is mining activity in secs. 1 and 2.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and farmers. Access into the township is provided by Grass Valley Road, a graded gravel road, and other trail and desert roads.</p>
