	<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land, within Township 44 North, Range 39 East, is mountainous and the elevation ranges from about 6000 to 9730 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from clay loam in the lower elevations to gravelly and rocky. The timber is composed of scattered mahogany and aspen. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and native grasses.</p> <p>There are several springs and creeks, throughout the township affording a good supply of water. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Principal use of the area is livestock grazing and recreation. Access into the township is provided by graded roads and trail roads.</p>
