The cor. of Tps. 43 and 44 N., Rs. 40 and 41 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

N. 89° 12' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over mountainous land draining SE.; asc. 500 ft. to ¼ sec. cor., through sagebrush and scattered mahogany.

40.54 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 12 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to the cap, 5 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.
