DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE NORTH BOUNDARY OF
T. 44 N., R. 40 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA.

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by Fisher and Morrison, U. S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1882; a Portion Retraced by L. E. Bland, Cadastral Surveyor, in 1962 and 1963.

The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

N. 89° 20' W., bet. secs. 3 and 34.

Over rolling land, through sagebrush; desc. 250 ft. over a W. slope.

28.00 Ravine, drains SW.; asc. 180 ft. over a SE. slope.

39.90 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 34, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 12 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to the cap, 3 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.

41.00 Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 100 ft. over rolling land.

79.80 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, monumented with a mound of stone; there is no remaining evidence of the wooden post.

At the corner point.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 14 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to the cap, 4 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.
