of the Tp.

N. 0° 16' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over mountainous land, through sagebrush and scattered  
mahogany; asc. 60 ft. over a SE. slope.

15.00 Ridge, bears ENE. and SW.; desc. 30 ft. over a N. slope.

20.17 Point for the S. 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at  
proportionate distance.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 20 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

a NW. slope.

40.34 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at pro-  
portionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of  
the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 16 ins.  
in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to the  
cap, 4 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.
