GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
<p>The land within Township 44 North, Range 40 East, is mountainous and gently rolling. The elevation ranges from about 5800 to 8400 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from clay loam in the lower elevations to gravelly and rocky. The timber is composed of scattered mahogany and aspen. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and sparse native grasses.</p>	
<p>There are several springs and creeks throughout the township that drain into Martin Creek, which drains the township in a south-easterly direction. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>	
<p>Principal uses of the area are cattle grazing and recreation such as camping, fishing and hunting. Access into the township is provided by graded gravel roads and trail roads.</p>
